

## **PNP OPERATIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT**

### **2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2020**

The unexpected outbreak of the COVID 19 worldwide pandemic has also greatly affected our country in almost every aspect of human life. Amidst this crisis the Philippine National Police, upon the instructions of President Rodrigo R Duterte extended every possible assistance to the community in maintaining peace and order and assist the local government in the delivery of much needed government services.

In support to the community protection to help mitigate the pandemic, the PNP also continues to work hard in enforcing the law and sustain its anti-criminality campaign against illegal drugs and illegal gambling. Moreover, the PNP intensified the momentum on the campaign against other crimes that resulted in the decline of the national crime rate, particularly on the eight focus crimes namely: murder, homicide, physical injury, rape, robbery, theft, carnapping of motor vehicles and motorcycles.

#### **Enhanced Managing Police Operations**

The Enhanced MPO widened the anti-criminality operational plan particularly on its Regular Law Enforcement activities through Police Presence, Focused Law Enforcement Operations and Crime Solution; enhanced the Security Measures through Target Hardening, Border Control, Social Investigation, and proper Deployment of Resources. It also improved the information operations through the maximum use of TRIMP in intensifying public awareness. The Contingency Planning through regular conduct of SIMEX, CEREX, COMMEX were also upgraded. The mandatory organization of Red Teams to challenge the security preparations of a unit significantly improved. Meanwhile, for the Feedback Mechanism, various inter-agency committees were organized and meet regularly to review respective activities and harmonize their efforts; and for Offensive Stance aggressive tactical operations is being conducted, while for Legal Offensive, the Inter-Agency Cooperation on Legal Action (IACOLA) was established.

#### ***Eight Focus Crimes***

One of the most significant result of the campaign against criminality is the impact on Crime Volume, particularly on the **Focus Crimes** (murder, homicide, physical injury, rape, robbery, theft, carnapping of motorcycles and motor vehicle) were **generally decreased by 10,260 incidents or 60%** from 17,106 in 2nd Quarter 2019 to 6,846 for the same period of the current year.

### Regular Law Enforcement

**Police Presence.** The reductions in the eight focus crimes were sustained with the intensified police presence wherein a total of 6,661,855 foot and mobile patrol operations were conducted with 78,151,204 man-hours of foot patrols and 40,049,265 man-hours of mobile patrols were spent. Additionally, 112 Dedicated Control Points manned by 1,257 HPG personnel and 1,398 Quarantine Control Points manned by 14,154 PNP personnel were established in relation to COVID-19.

**Focused Law Enforcement.** Aggressive police operations and other police interventions led to the arrest of lawless elements that somehow reduced the number of crimes that they may have committed.

**Campaign against Illegal Drugs.** For the period, there were 399 illegal drug personalities who surrendered to police stations nationwide. meanwhile, Police operations against illegal drugs resulted in the arrest of 14,714 illegal drug personalities and the confiscation of illegal drugs with an estimated DDB value of more than Php12.1 Billion.

Among the notable accomplishments on the Campaign against Illegal Drugs include the following:

**Campaign against Carnapping.** For the period in review, there were 242 carnapping incidents reported of which 29 were four-wheeled vehicles and 213 motorcycles. Of these incidents, 17 motor vehicles and 77 motorcycles were recovered which translates to a recovery efficiency rating of 39%. In addition, 105 suspects were arrested and three were killed during police operations while 76 cases were filed in courts.

**Campaign against Kidnapping-for-Ransom (KFR).** Three KFR incidents were reported for the period. Of the total incidents, five personalities were arrested and two cases were solved.

**Campaign Plan “Clean Rider”.** The Enhanced Managing Police Operation was reinvigorated with the implementation of Campaign Plan “Clean Rider”, a comprehensive approach that aims to totally eliminate crimes committed by motorcycle riding criminals/suspects. It likewise ensures the safety and security of motorcycle and prevents the use of impounded/stolen motorcycles for criminal activities.

**Campaign against Motorcycle Suspects.** Of the 226 incidents involving motorcycle suspects, five are drug related. Of these incidents, 44 were cleared

and 57 were solved while the remaining 125 are still under investigation. As to the status of suspects, 46 were arrested, four were killed during police response and the rest remained at large.

***Campaign against Illegal Gambling.*** The campaign against illegal gambling was also prioritized. In support of Small Town Lottery (STL), a total of 5,643 police operations were conducted that resulted in the arrest of 16,826 violators and confiscation of more than Php6.1 Million worth of cash and articles used in illegal gambling. Four Thousand Three Hundred Nine cases were filed in courts.

Heeding to the special instruction of PRRD on the Banning of Government Employees from gambling in Casinos, all RDs coordinated with the management of casinos in their respective AOR to have signages posted at the entrance of their establishments.

***Campaign against Loose Firearms.*** The relentless efforts to account loose firearms resulted in the confiscation, recovery and surrender of 3,852 small arms and light weapons (SALW). The campaign likewise resulted in the arrest of 1,796 suspects and filing of 1,251 criminal cases in courts for violations of Republic Act No.10591.

***Campaign against Private Armed Groups (PAGs).*** For the period covered, three were arrested, one surrendered, one killed in police operations and two cases were filed in courts.

***Campaign against Smuggling and Piracy.*** PNP operations resulted in the confiscation of more than Php11.6 worth of smuggled and pirated goods. Forty-four persons were arrested and eight cases were filed in courts. Other cases were turned-over to the Bureau of Customs.

***Campaign against Illegal Logging.*** There were 1,193 operations against illegal logging that resulted in the arrest of 882 suspects. In these operations, a total of 743,427 board feet of logs/lumber with an estimated worth of Php43.9 Million was confiscated. Two Hundred Ninety-Nine cases were filed in courts.

***Campaign against Illegal Fishing.*** A total of 4,092 suspects were arrested for illegal fishing and 221 cases were filed in courts. The police operations also resulted in the confiscation of Php58.8 Million worth of fish and fishing paraphernalia.

***Campaign against Criminal Gangs (CGs).*** Eight CGs were disbanded. A total of 246 leaders and members were accounted of which 233 were arrested and 13 were killed in police operations nationwide. Also, 27 firearms were confiscated/surrendered and 31 cases were filed in courts.

**Campaign against Wanted Persons with Reward.** The crackdown on the country's Top Most Wanted Persons (TMWPs) with monetary rewards for their capture resulted in the arrests of four, one surrendered and one killed in police operations.

**Campaign against Other Wanted Persons.** The crackdown on other Wanted Persons (OWPs) resulted in the arrests of 8,328, surrender of seven and death of 34 in police operations.

## **Security Measures**

**Target Hardening** is the next line of defense when prevention through intelligence fails. Activities were undertaken to strengthen the security of our police stations, camps and other vital installations in order to protect them from enemy attack and eliminate the element of surprise. For the period, a total of 710,000 target hardening activities were conducted such as preventive patrols, inspection of motor repair shops, inspection of vital installations, and police route security assistance among others.

**Border Control** is protecting our entrance and exit points from the illegal movement of contraband and lawless elements while promoting safety and security of the community. A total of 251,449 border control operations were conducted during the period.

The PNP utilizes **Social Investigation** in getting to know the community. Before they are organized and mobilized, police units conduct preliminary studies of every barangay in terms of physical environment, economic status or lifestyle, so that appropriate interventions are undertaken in operationalizing PNP MC 2015-009, or the Revitalized Barangay Peace Action Team (BPAT). Social Investigation makes the target community responsive to the disaster preparedness and peace and order peculiarity of the barangay/sector studied. For the period, there were 98,101 social investigation activities conducted.

**The PNP Internal Security Operations Campaign Plan 'KATATAGAN' 2017-2022** was developed to complement the AFP Development Support and Security Plan "KAPAYAPAAN" 2017-2022. It intends to develop the PNP capability against threat groups; enhance legal offensive against insurgents; promote public safety and order; and adhere to the rule of law, human rights and social justice.

**Joint Peace and Security Coordinating Center (JPSCC).** JPSCCs are organized in the regional, provincial and highly urbanized city (HUC) levels. Meetings are regularly conducted to promote interoperability and maintain the highest level of coordination between and among PNP and AFP territorial units.

**Ending Local Communists Armed Conflict (ELCAC).** In defeating the Local Communist Terrorists Groups (LCTGs), President Rodrigo R Duterte issued

Executive Order 70 (EO 70) providing for a Whole-of-Nation approach in defeating the Local Communist Terrorist Groups (LCTGs) who have been among the prime threats to the country's peace and security. Through this EO, a National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC) was created, with the President as the National Task Force Commander.

The PNP in coordination with the AFP, other government and non-government agencies have organized nine clusters of NTF-ELCAC in the regional level down to the provincial level in order to support the objective to end the local communist armed conflict nationwide. The objectives are: to establish close linkages and cooperation with the AFP, other government and non-government organizations; to participate actively in the realization of the goals of the clusters where PNP are members; and to ensure that efforts of the PNP from the National to the regional and provincial levels are synchronized.

***Campaign against Communist Terrorist Groups (CTGs).*** The PNP figured in seven government-initiated encounters that resulted in the capture of six, one wounded, death of 25 CTGs during police operations, and the confiscation of 70 small and light weapons (SALW). In other police operations against CNN resulted in the arrest of 36, surrender of 537, death of two, and confiscation of 182 SALW.

***Campaign against Local Terrorist Groups (LTGs).*** One government-initiated encounter was reported during the period that resulted in the killing of two LTG members during police operations and confiscation of one firearm. Results of other operations against LTGs include the arrest of 23, surrender of five, nine died during police operations, and confiscation of ten SALW.

**Public Safety.** The PNP had enhanced the capabilities of the 1,978 Tourist Assistance Desks (TADs) being maintained nationwide with the deployment of trained personnel. This is in addition to the 558 Tourist Assistance Centers (TACs) established by the Department of Tourist (DOT) and Local Government Units (LGUs).

### **Conduct of SIMEX/CEREX/COMMEX**

The conduct of Simulation Exercises (SIMEX), Crisis Emergency Response Exercises (CEREX), and Communication Exercises (COMMEX) establish interoperability among participating agencies. A total of 5,069 exercises were undertaken such as earthquake drills, fire drills, camp defense, and hostage taking among others.

### **Red Teaming**

The PNP recognized **Red Teaming** as vital in the crafting and implementation of security and contingency plans for major and special events. It aims to expose the vulnerabilities within the organization as well as challenges the security preparation so that these can be properly addressed. The PNP, as a major security provider, has institutionalized Red Teaming. It has also organized

local Red Teams in every major event in their respective areas. Local Red Teams were organized in all sites of major events. Additionally, a National Red Team (NRT) was organized composed of eight (8) PNP members ready to be deployed when needed.

The PNP Red Team validated the operational implementation of the PNP-AFP-PCG-BFP Joint Implementation Directive Nr 1-2020 in support to the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Disease (IATF-MEID). It also assists in the formulation of peace and order, as well as security preparedness plans, likewise validates the performance in the execution of plans, protocol and guidelines in PNP response to COVID-19.

### **Feedback Mechanism**

Various inter-agency committees institutionalized measures in the form of meetings, resolutions, and review activities as feedback mechanism.

***National Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee (NALECC).*** The Chief, PNP chairs the NALECC that has 66 member agencies. Strengthening of linkages with the other law enforcement agencies was sustained through regular meetings and lateral coordination with committee members. At the regional level, RLECCs are likewise organized and chaired by the PNP Regional Directors.

***Joint Anti-Bank Robbery and Cybercrime Coordinating Committee (JABRACC).*** The Committee serves as the main task force of the PNP in the campaign against organized crime groups and criminal gangs involved in bank robbery and related crimes to fortify measures against bank robbery, fraud and other related crimes. The JABRACC, composed of the PNP, other government agencies and stakeholders from the banking sector, holds regular meetings to further strengthen coordination among its members.

### **Offensive Stance**

**Tactical Operations.** The Inter-Agency Committee on Legal Action, wherein the PNP is a member agency, strengthened the intelligence gathering and cooperation, investigation, prosecution and monitoring of cases against threat groups. Out of the 120 incidents involving threat groups, 36 cases were referred at the Prosecutors Office and 22 cases were filed in courts, while the remaining 62 are under investigation.
