

**PNP's OPERATIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT**  
**2nd Quarter 2019**

The PNP, as the nation's premier law enforcement institution, is committed to fully support President Rodrigo Roa Duterte's call for change, particularly the relentless war against illegal drugs, crime and corruption. It embarks on further intensifying the implementation of the PNP's program thrusts towards attaining a truly peaceful and drug-free nation. With the relentless war on illegal drugs raging more intensely and amidst the incessant noise of critics of the drug war, the PNP soldiers on while constantly reassuring the Filipino people of its sincere adherence to the requirements of due process, human rights and the rule of law. At the same time, the PNP intensifies the momentum of the campaign against crime and sustaining in the process the decline in the crime rate, particularly of the eight focus crimes namely, murder, homicide, physical injury, rape, robbery, theft, and carnapping of motor vehicles and motorcycles.

**Enhanced Managing Police Operations (EMPO)**

The EMPO widens the anti-criminality operational plan on regular law enforcement activities through police presence and focused law enforcement operations; security measures through target hardening, border control, social investigation, community partnership, proper deployment of resources; information operations through maximum use of quad media in intensifying public awareness; contingency planning through regular conduct of SIMEX, CEREX, and COMMEX; organization of red teams to challenge security preparations; feedback mechanism; and offensive stance through tactical operations and legal offensive.

***Eight Focus Crimes***

One of the most significant results of the campaign against criminality is the impact on Crime Volume, where **Focus Crimes** (murder, homicide, physical injury, rape, robbery, theft, carnapping of motorcycles and motor vehicle) **generally decreased by 4,269 incidents or 20%** from 20,991 in the 2nd Quarter 2018 to 16,722 for the same period of the current year.

### Regular Law Enforcement

**Police Presence.** The reductions of the eight focus crimes, street crimes and other prevalent crimes were sustained due to the presence of policemen in the streets. For the period, a total of 5,099,859 foot and mobile patrols were conducted wherein 59,482,135 and 29,809,478 man-hours were spent, respectively.

**Focused Law Enforcement.** Aggressive police operations and other interventions led to the arrest of lawless elements, further contributing to the significant reduction of crimes.

**Campaign against Illegal Drugs.** For the 2nd Quarter of 2019, there were 1,641 illegal drug personalities who surrendered to police stations nationwide. Meanwhile, 111,475 were arrested and 2,238 died during police operations, and an estimated DDB value of more than Php1.1 Billion illegal drugs were confiscated.

Among the notable accomplishments include the following:

***Campaign against Carnapping.*** During the period in review, there were 922 carnapping incidents reported involving 68 four-wheeled vehicles and 854 motorcycles. Of these incidents, 49 four-wheeled vehicles and 187 motorcycles were recovered, translating to a recovery efficiency of 26%. In addition, 225 suspects were arrested and 11 were killed during police operations while 168 cases were filed in courts.

***Campaign against Kidnapping-for-Ransom (KFR).*** Six (6) KFR incidents were reported for the same period, resulting in the arrest of nine (9) and surrender of one (1) personalities, and the filing of five (5) cases.

***Campaign Plan "Clean Rider".*** The EMPO mentioned earlier was reinvigorated with the implementation of Campaign Plan "Clean Rider", a comprehensive approach that aims to totally eliminate crimes committed by motorcycle-riding criminals/suspects. It likewise ensures the safety and security of motorcycle riders and prevents the use of stolen motorcycles for criminal activities.

***Campaign against Motorcycle-Riding Suspects.*** Of the 798 reported incidents involving motorcycle-riding suspects, only six (6) were drug related. A total of 154 cases were cleared and 151 were solved while the remaining 493 are still under investigation. As to the status of suspects, 150 were arrested, 26 were killed during police response and the rest remained at large.

***Campaign against Illegal Gambling.*** The campaign against illegal gambling was also prioritized. There were 4,232 operations conducted resulting in the arrest of 10,802 violators and confiscation of more than Php2.5 Million worth of cash and articles used in illegal gambling. Three Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Four (3,774) cases were filed in courts.

Heeding to the special instruction of PRRD on the banning of government employees from gambling in casinos, all RDs were directed to coordinate with the management of casinos to have signages posted at the entrances of their establishments.

***Campaign against Loose Firearms.*** The relentless efforts to account loose firearms resulted in the confiscation, recovery and surrender of 3,370 small arms and light weapons (SALW). There were 2,915 suspects arrested and 1,758 criminal cases filed in courts against them for violations of Republic Act No. 10591.

***Campaign against Private Armed Groups (PAGs).*** For the period covered, seven (7) PAG members were arrested, eight (8) surrendered and one (1) died during police operations. Four (4) firearms were likewise confiscated and recovered.

***Campaign against Smuggling and Piracy.*** PNP operations resulted in the confiscation of Php978,080.00 worth of smuggled and pirated goods. Five (5) cases were filed in courts, while other cases were turned-over to the Bureau of Customs for its proper disposition.

***Campaign against Illegal Logging.*** There were 755 operations conducted against illegal logging that led to the arrest of 689 suspects. In these operations, a total of 393,513 board feet of logs/lumber with an estimated worth of Php16.4 Million was confiscated. Two-hundred one (201) cases were filed in courts.

***Campaign against Illegal Fishing.*** A total of 5,343 suspects were arrested for illegal fishing and 340 cases were filed in courts. The operations also resulted in the confiscation of Php66.5 Million worth of fish and fishing paraphernalia.

***Campaign against Criminal Gangs (CGs).*** Twenty-one (21) CGs were disbanded that resulted in 595 members arrested and 12 members killed in police operations nationwide. Also, 21 assorted firearms were confiscated/recovered and 26 cases were filed in courts against those involved.

***Campaign against Wanted Persons with Reward.*** The crackdown on the country's Top Most Wanted Persons (TMWPs) with monetary rewards resulted in the capture/arrest of 11.

***Campaign against Other Wanted Persons.*** Likewise, the crackdown on other Wanted Persons (OWPs) resulted in the arrest of 15,219, surrender of 63 and deaths of 20 in police operations.

## **Security Measures**

***Target Hardening*** is the next line of defense when prevention through intelligence fails. These are activities conducted to strengthen the security of our police stations, camps and other vital installations. This measure denies the CTGs and other terrorist groups from launching their attacks and offensives. For the period, a total of 1,138,524 target hardening measures/activities were conducted such as preventive patrols, inspection of motor repair shops, inspection of vital installations, and police route security assistance.

***Border Control*** is protecting our entrance and exit points from the illegal movement of contraband and lawless elements, and at the same time promoting the safety and security of the community. A total of 376,660 operations were conducted during the period.

The PNP utilizes **Social Investigation** in getting to know the community. Before they are organized and mobilized, police units conduct preliminary studies of every barangay in terms of physical environment, economic status or lifestyle, so that appropriate interventions are undertaken in operationalizing PNP MC 2015-009, or the Revitalized Barangay Peace Action Team (BPAT). Social Investigation makes the target community responsive to the disaster preparedness and peace and order peculiarity of the barangay/sector studied. For the period, there were 153,761 social investigation activities conducted.

**PNP Internal Security Operations Campaign Plan ‘KATATAGAN’ 2017-2022** was developed to complement the AFP Development Support and Security Plan “KAPAYAPAAAN” 2017-2022. It intends to develop the PNP operational capability against threat groups, enhance legal offensives against insurgents, promote public safety and order, and adhere to the rule of law, human rights and social justice.

***Joint Peace and Security Coordinating Center (JPSCC).*** JPSCCs are organized in the regional, provincial and highly urbanized city (HUC) levels. Meetings are regularly conducted to promote interoperability and maintain the highest level of coordination between and among PNP and AFP territorial units. There were a total of 581 coordinative meetings conducted for the period in review.

***Campaign against Communist Terrorist Groups (CTG).*** The PNP figured in 12 government-initiated encounters that resulted in one captured, one (1) wounded and three (3) killed CTG members during police operations and the confiscation of eight (8) small and light weapons (SALW). In other operations conducted against these groups, three members were arrested, 33 surrendered

and ten killed, while 20 SALWs were confiscated. Other notable accomplishments on this campaign was the arrest of Virgilio Paragan a.k.a. Hassan on June 23, 2019 at Poblacion Tacas, Cuartero, Capiz. He has a standing warrant of arrest for Murder and two (2) cases for Attempted and Frustrated Murder. He has a head prize of Php1,050,000.00 for his capture.

**Campaign against Local Terrorist Groups (LTGs).** In the campaign against Abu Sayyaf, BIFF, Maute, ISIS-inspired and other LTGs, three (3) government-initiated encounters were recorded that resulted in the killing of eight (8) members during police operations. In other operations against these groups, eight (8) were arrested.

**Public Safety.** The PNP enhanced the capabilities of the 1,978 Tourist Assistance Desks (TADs) maintained nationwide. This is in addition to the 558 Tourist Assistance Centers (TACs) established by the Department of Tourist (DOT) and Local Government Units (LGUs). Also, there were 38,108 Tourist Police deployed in 30 Priority Tourist Destination Areas.

On providing security coverage, the major event security framework was the basis for crafting the security and contingency plans to 20,292 major and special events. The PNP rendered 6,154,109 man-hours for these events plus another 1,308,892 man-hours for the 12,425 VIP security operations it likewise conducted.

### **Conduct of SIMEX/CEREX/COMMEX**

The conduct of Simulation Exercises (SIMEX), Crisis Emergency Response Exercises (CEREX), and Communication Exercises (COMMEX) established interoperability among participating agencies. A total of 25,459 exercises were undertaken such as earthquake drills, fire drills, camp defense, and hostage taking among others.

### **Red Teaming**

The PNP recognized **Red Teaming** as vital in the crafting and implementation of security and contingency plans for major and special events. It aims to expose vulnerabilities within the organization so that security adjustments are properly made and addressed. The PNP, as a major security provider, has institutionalized Red Teaming. Local Red Teams were organized in all sites of major events. Also, a National Red Team (NRT) has been organized and deployed composed of eight (8) PNP members.

### **Feedback Mechanism**

Various inter-agency committees institutionalized measures in the form of meetings, resolutions, and review activities as feedback mechanism.

***National Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee (NALECC).*** The CPNP chairs the NALECC that has 66 member agencies. Strengthening of linkages with these other law enforcement agencies was sustained through regular meetings and lateral coordination with committee members. At the regional levels, RLECCs are likewise organized and chaired by the PNP RDs.

***Joint Anti-Bank Robbery and Cybercrime Coordinating Committee (JABRACC).*** Meetings were held to fortify measures against bank robbery, fraud and other related crimes. The Committee serves as the main task force of the PNP in the campaign against organized crime groups and criminal gangs involved in bank robbery and related crimes. The JABRACC, composed of the PNP, other government agencies and stakeholders from the banking sector, holds regular meetings to further strengthen coordination among its members.

## **Offensive Stance**

**Tactical Operations.** The Inter-Agency Committee on Legal Action, wherein the PNP is a member agency, strengthened the intelligence gathering, cooperation, investigation, prosecution and monitoring of cases against threat groups. Out of the 99 incidents involving threat groups, 16 cases were referred at the Prosecutors Office and one case was filed in court, while the remaining 82 remain under investigation.
